South Alabama had a big day offensively on Saturday in the Rose Bowl as they did not allow a sack, and offensively did not have a minus play on the day. The only play that lost yards on Saturday against the Bruins was the fake field goal opportunity in the fourth quarter.



GUAJARDO LEADS THE NATION

South Alabama kicker Diego Guajardo continues to lead the nation in field goals, converting on each of his attempts this season (all four). His only miss kicking this year was on an extra point at Central Michigan when the ball hit off both posts in the win.



#SWARMD AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

South Alabama currently ranks among the nation's best on the defensive side of the football in total defense. They enter the week ranked in the top 40 overall with some of the best defenses from the NCAA in the past few years, including two weeks ago holding Lew Nichols to just 20 yards rushing.

SERIES HISTORY

South Alabama and Louisiana Tech have met two times in school history with the Bulldogs winning both of those games. The two teams have not met since 2018, a 30-26 Louisiana Tech victory in Mobile.

JAGS AGAINST CONFERENCE USA

South Alabama has played several teams who are currently in Conference USA, but not necessarily in the conference when the two teams faced off against each other. The Jags are 2-7 against teams from C-USA, but 2-3 against teams who are currently in Conference USA but were in the Sun Belt Conference when they met.

JAGS AFTER A LOSS UNDER WOMMACK

South Alabama lost back-to-back games under head coach Kane Wommack in his first year after starting of the season 3-0 in non-conference play before closing out the year with four straight losses to finish 5-7.

JAGS BACK HOME FOR NON-CONFERENCE TILT, NOT BAD AT HANCOCK WHITNEY

Since opening Hancock Whitney Stadium in 2020, South Alabama is 2-2 all-time at home in non-conference games including winning their last two games. The Jags have averaged 27.5 points per game offensively, while giving up just 24.3 points per game in those four games.

GUAJARDO PERFECT IN FIELD GOALS SO FAR THIS SEASON

South Alabama kicker Diego Guajardo is perfect so far this season for the Jags from field goal range, converting on all four of his attempts, including a 38-yard field goal in the Rose Bowl on Saturday in the loss to UCLA. He has also converted on 5-of-6 of his extra points with his only miss hitting off of both posts at Central Michigan in a non-conference win for the Jags just two weeks ago.

NEW NAME HEADING INTO 2022

DJ Thomas-Jones will look familiar to those in the Mobile area when he takes the field for the Jags this season, but he will also look a little different when looking at the roster. The Ole Miss transfer and former Saraland High School star has hyphenated his name heading into the 2022 season to honor his stepfather - Stevie.

Thomas-Jones played six games last season for the Rebels before transferring and the former three-star returned to his hometown area where he starred for Saraland and was ranked as the 13th-best tight end in the nation.

BRADLEY NAME SYNONOMOUS WITH THE GAME OF FOOTBALL

Carter Bradley, a transfer from Toledo, has a name that is no stranger to football. He has done his part to make a name for himself, including playing in eight games last season and helping the team earn a bid to the Bahamas Bowl. He finished 18-of-28 passing for 221 yards and a score as the Rockets dropped a three-point decision at No. 7 Notre Dame, before posting a season-best 254 yards after connecting on 22-of-36 attempts the next week against Colorado State.

But it's the last name that commands respect from the NFL as his father, Gus Bradley, is one of the most well-known and respected coaches in the game. He currently serves as the defensive coordinator for the Indianapolis Colts. He came to prominence as the defensive coordinator for the Seattle Seahawks from 2009 to 2012, where he was the original play caller of the team's Legion of Boom secondary. Bradley later served as the head coach of the Jacksonville Jaguars from 2013 to 2016. Following his dismissal from Jacksonville, he returned to assistant coaching and became the Colts' defensive coordinator in 2022.

It was during the time the time in Seattle where Carter

decided to play quarterback and not on both sides of the ball, getting to spend time with then-Seahawks quarterback Russell Wilson.

SEEING DOUBLE THIS SEASON

Opponents will be seeing double this year when they line up against the Jags as South Alabama will have a set of twins - one on each side of the ball. Devin Voisin will line up at receiver where he is expected to start, and brother Jaden will be lining up on defense this season for the Jags.

JAGS IN THE NFL DRAFT

With the 88th pick of the third round, Jalen Tolbert became the third University of South of Alabama football player to be selected by the National Football League by the Dallas Cowboys in the 2022 Draft held at Allegiant Stadium in Paradise, Nevada, home of the Las Vegas Raiders.

Tolbert joined a list of draft picks for the Jags that includes:
